DESIGNER KATIE LEEDE CURATES A TREASURE TROVE OF LOCAL FINDS ORIGINATING FROM NEAR AND FAR. BY LAUREN BROCATO

Designer and shopkeeper Katie Leede (katieleede.com) imagines a worldly space while digging her feet into the warm Sag Harbor sand. The textile guru brings an artful essence to every space she touches and also does so here, playing upon a theme of "home as a treasure trove."
